

# Guidance for third parties on the Open Government Licence



*developing people, improving young lives*

## Background

As part of the Government's commitment to greater transparency the National Archives have developed the Open Government Licence (OGL) and the UK Government Licensing Framework. This enables and encourages the free use of government information, including information and resources created by the Training and Development Agency for Schools (TDA).

Some TDA-produced materials have been made available under the Open Government Licence and now are available for download from the [Resources page on the TDA website](#). The materials are published and unpublished resources from the Teacher Training Resource Bank (TTRB), Multiverse, Behaviour4Learning and the Subject Resource Networks.

The TDA's Intellectual Property (IP) in relation to these materials is covered by this licence with the exception of the technical infrastructure of our web based systems. There will be exceptions on video and photography, which can only be re-used if it is maintained in its original state and used for its original purpose

The licence is similar to a Creative Commons attribution licence and a key point of the OGL is that it allows commercial exploitation. Please visit the National Archives Website for more details.

As a result, in all but a very small number of cases, TDA intellectual property and materials in relation to the TTRB, Multiverse, Behaviour4Learning and the Subject Resource Networks can be used by anybody under this non-exclusive licence. This means that they will be open for wider, free use, and potentially add greater value.

Any third party re-using or re-purposing any TDA material under the Open Government Licence must follow the guidance below, including the provision, where appropriate of the relevant statements and attributions.

### Print

If you have print or digital copies of TDA materials from the TTRB, Multiverse, behaviour4learning or Subject Resource Networks for reproduction, the existing TDA rights statement is superseded by the Open Government Licence.

- The derived material should carry the following attribution:

- In the case of derived works the attribution above should include a link from the words Open Government Licence to a central location/page with the OGL copyright and link text;
- Video and photography can only be re-used if it is maintained in its original state and used for its original purpose.

## Note to webmasters

It is helpful to tell search engines, like Google, that the link to the Open Government Licence is to a licence, and not a general link. This can be done in HTML, by using the rel="license" attribute. This will flag up with web crawlers and other internet users using automated systems that the information is subject to a licence with particular terms and conditions, which can be found by following the link.

Where, possible, information providers should point to the permanent identifier for the Open Government Licence by embedding the following link:
